The fiscal strength of the journal continues to be a considerable source of income for ANS and AOS to further the missions of these societies via contracted royalty guarantees and profit sharing from our publisher, Wolters Kluwer Health. Our long-term publishing consultant, Kathey Alexander has retired, and we have retained Kathleen Gaffney as our new consultant who will be instrumental as we guide our journal forward into the future.

Our Editor-in-Chief, Larry Lustig, MD and his team of associate editors continue to provide excellent leadership and stewardship of *Otology and Neurotology*, the leading journal worldwide in the field of otology, neurotology and hearing health related disorders. The current impact factor is 1.712.

2021 will mark the first year of the publication of *Otology and Neurotology Open*, (ONO). After an extensive international search, the search committee selected Michael Hoffer, MD as the inaugural Editor-in-Chief. Dr. Hoffer has assembled a diverse and accomplished editorial team which includes Dr. Elizabeth Toh as Deputy Editor-in-Chief and associate editors Drs. C. 
Open access publishing is based on the premise that scientific advances should not be restricted to only those who have the privilege of access to a medical library. By disseminating important scientific advances, open access publication seeks to allow everyone to benefit from new discoveries and everyone to participate in developing solutions for the future.

Most established medical journals have created an openaccess version of their publication to allow authors to publish in this fashion since open access publishing is increasingly becoming mandated by funding organizations, certain states, and in many countries around world. *ONO* will be a rigorously peer-reviewed publication similar to other publications in our field and will provide additional pages and opportunities for publishing material that is important to our specialty.

In addition, the fully open access nature of the journal will allow for almost unlimited color figures and word counts as well as the ability to directly include raw data as some grant agencies now require. *ONO* is an important complement to *Otology & Neurotology* and the educational missions of the ANS and AOS. As members of ANS and AOS we need scholarly contributions, ideas on interesting subjects to cover, your participation as a reviewer, and your acceptance of the value of legitimate open access publications.
