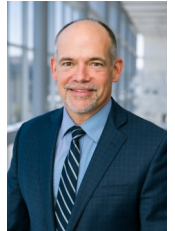

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT David S. Haynes, MD, MMHC



It is a great honor to serve as President of the American Neurotology Society this year. The ANS has had a profound influence on me and my career, just as it has on many of you. I have served on the ANS Executive Council for many years, and many of our discussions center on how the Society can best serve its membership and, ultimately, the patients entrusted to our care. Those discussions lead to educational initiatives that can affect meaningful change in how we deliver cutting-edge care appropriately and in a timely manner.

The efforts of the ANS are evident in our educational offerings: our Spring Meeting at COSM, our annual Fall Meeting ("Fab Friday"), our study groups, our journal, *Otology & Neurotology*, which we proudly share with our excellent partner, the *American Otological Society*, and the many webinars held throughout the year. For an organization of our size, this represents a tremendous commitment to education. Our leadership remains dedicated to this mission because it provides our members with the latest technologies, techniques, and knowledge to improve outcomes for our patients.

Our previous President, Colin Driscoll, MD, and my friend, wrote in his final presidential message about change. I completely agree with his thoughts. I have always disliked hearing the phrase, "Doctors don't like change." On the contrary, if we did not embrace change, there would be no meetings, study groups, webinars, or journal. We seek out these opportunities because they help us continually improve the care we provide and the outcomes we achieve for our patients.

This year's Fall Meeting reflects many of the themes that have been important throughout my career. Additional highlights include our Franklin Rizer Memorial Lecturer, *Kyla Terhune, MD, MBA* from the American College of Surgeons, who shares my interest in the science of developing expertise. *Nicole Jiam, MD*, will discuss strategies to improve patient access and strengthen referral pathways within our practices. *Shawn Stevens, MD*, will lead a panel on cochlear implant access. Currently, fewer than 10% of patients who could benefit from a cochlear implant actually receive one, and this discussion will focus on addressing those barriers. *Michael Hoa, MD*, will lead a panel of experts discussing how gene therapy will transform our practices and how we can prepare our clinics for this exciting new era. *Seilesh Babu, MD*, will moderate a panel on controversial topics in our field, including challenging cases, operational issues within our clinics and operating rooms, and medicolegal controversies. There truly is something for everyone at this year's Fall Meeting. Our Education Director, *Christine Dinh, MD*, has worked tirelessly with our moderators and panelists to make this an outstanding educational program.

Finally, in keeping with this year's educational theme, I'd like to highlight the upcoming North American Skull Base Society, (NASBS) Meeting in Nashville, Tennessee. It is a tremendous honor that the ANS has been invited to host an entire pre-meeting day dedicated to Vestibular Schwannoma and NF2 on Thursday, February 25, 2027. This educational program will feature lectures, surgical dissection courses, and cutting-edge hearing preservation techniques. We hope to see a strong turnout from the ANS membership in support of this exciting initiative.

Again, it is a great honor—and one of the highlights of my career—to serve as President of the American Neurotology Society. Thank you for your continued dedication to our Society and to the patients we serve. I look forward to seeing many of you in Los Angeles this October.

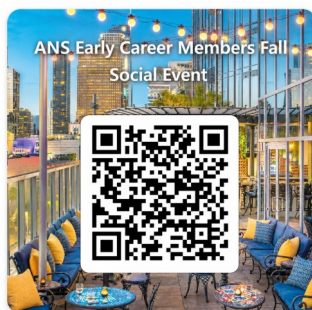

ANS AWARDS FOUR RESEARCH GRANTS!

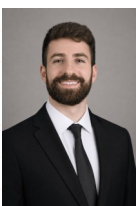
The ANS offers a number of \$25,000 grants each year, to encourage and support academic research in sciences related to the investigation of Otology and Neurotology and prepare clinician-scientist to early career research awards. Grants are available to physician investigators in the United States and Canada only. *We particularly encourage those individuals without a history of K08, R03, R21, or R01 funding to apply.* The ANS Research Committee endorsed by the ANS Executive Council reviewed a record breaking 24 applications and selected four research grant recipients for funding cycle 2026-2027.

Planning to apply? The application deadline for the 2027–2028 ANS Research Grant funding cycle is March 1, 2027.

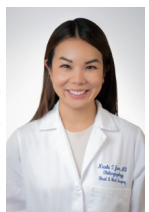

Jumah G. Ahmad, MD was selected as a 2026 ANS Research Grant recipient, with funding provided in partnership with the Vestibular Disorders Association (VeDA) and ANS for his grant titled, ***"Assessing Vestibular Dysfunction in Older Cochlear Implant Patients and Identifying High Risk Candidates."*** Dr. Ahmad is currently a Neurotology and Lateral Skull Base Surgery Fellow in the Department of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Utah. He earned bachelor's degrees in Biomedicine and Chemistry from the University of Missouri in Kansas City and completed his medical training at the University of Missouri School of Medicine. He then completed residency training in Otorhinolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston/MD Anderson Cancer Center. Dr. Ahmad will join the faculty at Duke University, where he plans to develop an academic research program focused on technology-forward approaches to clinical and translational research in cochlear implantation and vestibular schwannoma. Under the mentorship of Richard K. Gurgel, MD, and with collaborators in physical therapy, his research will prospectively evaluate older adults undergoing cochlear implantation using patient-reported dizziness measures, wearable motion sensors, and otolith function testing. This study aims to characterize early postoperative vestibular dysfunction, identify patients at increased risk for balance decline and falls, and inform future strategies for perioperative counseling, electrode selection, and vestibular rehabilitation. Outside of work, Dr. Ahmad enjoys fútbol, table tennis, hiking, and spending time with his family.



Peter Dixon, MD MSc was selected as a 2026 research grant recipient for his grant titled, ***"Health Trajectories Across the Adult Lifespan After Cochlear Implantation."*** Dr. Dixon is an Assistant Professor of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) in Charleston, SC. He completed his medical training and his MSc in Clinical Epidemiology at the University of Toronto, followed by fellowship training in Neurotology at the University of California San Diego. His research links a prospective cochlear implant candidacy registry with population-wide longitudinal health records - a dataset uniquely capable of tracking health and healthcare use across decades - to evaluate whether cochlear implantation is associated with preserved aging in place among confirmed adult candidates. Using an emulated target trial framework, this work measures the association between cochlear implantation and "time alive at home" free from institutionalization and acute care and characterizes how associations vary across baseline risk. Outside of work, Dr. Dixon and his wife, Sarah, are kept happily busy by their three young boys.



Nicole T. Jiam, MD was selected as a 2026 ANS Research Grant recipient for her grant titled, ***"Early Cortical Biomarkers of Acoustic-Electric Integration in Single-Sided Deafness Cochlear Implant Users."*** Dr. Jiam is a surgeon-scientist and Assistant Professor in the Division of Otology, Neurotology, and Skull Base Surgery within the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. She earned her bachelor's degree in neuroscience and her medical degree at Johns Hopkins, completed residency training in Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at UCSF, and a fellowship in Otology/Neurotology at Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts Eye and Ear. Her funded project uses high-density EEG to identify early cortical markers of interhemispheric integration during the first months after cochlear implantation for single-sided deafness, with the goal of developing objective, biomarker-guided tools to predict and improve rehabilitation outcomes. Her broader research program seeks to define the perceptual and neural mechanisms underlying variable cochlear implant outcomes and to translate them into precision, patient-oriented sensory restoration and rehabilitation - uniting psychophysics, electrophysiology, machine-learning prediction, and complex sound and music perception.



Matthew Steinhart, MD, PhD was selected as a 2026 research grant recipient for his grant titled, ***"Cell-State-Specific Transcriptional Programs Associated with Differential Growth of Vestibular Schwannomas"***. Dr. Steinhart is currently a PGY3 otolaryngology resident at Indiana University. He earned his bachelor's degree in neuroscience at Johns Hopkins University and completed his MD-PhD at Indiana University School of Medicine. This research project focuses on using single-cell transcriptomic sequencing to investigate molecular pathways associated with fast- and slow-growing vestibular schwannomas. This study aims to identify growth-associated signaling programs and potential therapeutic targets for patients with vestibular schwannoma. Outside of work, he enjoys spending time with his family.

ANS UNDER-REPRESENTED IN MEDICINE TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP

Natalia A. Alvarado Ramos is a fourth-year medical student at the University of Puerto Rico School of Medicine. Natalia will receive mentorship from Dr. Yu-Lan Mary Ying at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School during her away rotation.



Elena Quiñonez Del Cid is a fourth-year medical student at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Elena will receive mentorship from Dr. Rick Friedman at the University of California San Diego during her visiting otolaryngology rotation.

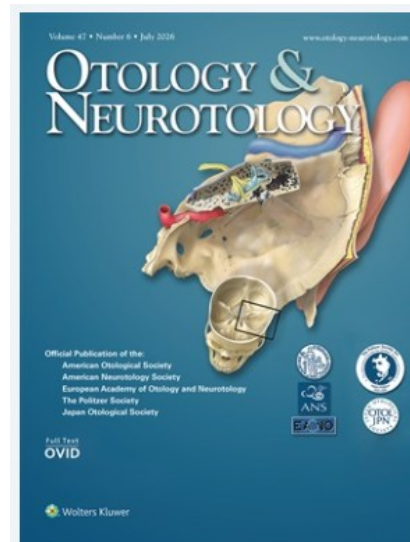

NEUROTOLOGY FELLOWSHIP AWARD (\$1000) - The Neurotology Fellow Award was established by the ANS in 1996 to reward scientific excellence. Applicants must be full-time participants in an ACGME approved Neurotology Fellowship.

TRAINEE AWARD (\$1000) - ANS offers up to two Trainee awards for the best clinical and basic science paper in Neurotology submitted by a Resident or Fellow in training in the field of Otolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery. Residents from any approved residency program or Fellows in Neurotology in the United States or Canada are eligible to compete.

NICHOLAS TOROK VESTIBULAR AWARD (\$1500) - established under the American Neurotology Society (ANS), is presented annually at the Society's Scientific Spring Meeting as part of a yearly lecture series. The subject should be an innovative observation, experience or technique in the field of vestibular basic science or clinical science.

HERBERT SILVERSTEIN AWARD FOR RESEARCH EXCELLENCE IN OTOTOLOGY/NEUROTOLOGY (\$1500)

The letter of intent must state the desired grant mechanism for the proposal (CSA, Fellowship grant, Clinical Investigation, Research grant or Multi-centered Clinical Cooperative Seed Grant), the Principal Investigator, and Institution(s), a working title, with an abstract and Specific Aims (2 page limit on abstract and aims). Biosketches and a cover letter should accompany the 2 page proposal summary, but it is not included as part of the two page summary. The next funding cycle begins July 1, 2027. Biosketches of all personnel are optional, but will be required if invited to submit a full application.

Complete applications will be invited from selected applicants based on the Research Advisory Board's review of the letters of intent. Applicants will be notified whether they are invited to submit a full application the 2nd week of December. Completed applications must be received by January 31st.
