Operative experience (text for fellowship to enter): Neurotology fellows typically graduate with >100 acoustic neuroma cases, predominantly via suboccipital and translabyrinthine approaches. Middle fossa approach is used for some tumors, but experience with superior canal dehiscence and CSF leak repairs will add 50 or more cases via this approach. Fellows will also have experience with approaches to the petrous apex as well as transotic/transcochlear approaches to the deep skull base. We place great emphasis on giving the neurotology fellow a hands-on operative experience, and they are expected to achieve surgical autonomy.

Call requirements: The neurotology fellows cover overnight call for the core otolaryngology residents once per year, on the night before the in-service exam.

Research: Great emphasis is given to developing a research trajectory for an academic career in neurotology. Areas of strength include many collaborations with the auditory and vestibular scientists in our Center for Hearing and Balance, Biomedical Engineering, the Laboratory for Computational Sensing and Robotics, and the Bloomberg School of Public Health. Fellows typically finish with at least several peerreviewed publications. Mentorship is provided to guide graduates on to funded and independent investigations.

Salary: Salary will depend on PGY Year. For example, salary for PGY 6 for the 2018-2019 year is \$68,470.

Additional Information: The 2nd-year fellow has their own otologic clinic with attending backup for scheduling their surgeries. We have excellent collaborations with five experienced neurosurgeons. Experience is provided with stereotactic radiation therapy, vestibular testing and rehabilitation, cochlear implant rehabilitation, oto-neurology clinic, interventional neuroradiology cases, and several tumor boards.
