Operative experience (text for fellowship to enter): The neurotology fellowship at Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai Hospital and NYEE of Mount Sinai offers a robust clinical experience in otology and neurotology at multiple sites. Broad exposure to lateral skull base procedures, including neurotologic procedures involving the posterior and middle cranial fossae, as well as the full gamut of otologic surgery. Tumor surgery (benign and malignant), CSF leak, cochlear implantation, stapes surgery, surgical management of chronic otomastoiditis/cholesteatoma and vestibular disorders are all a part of the fellow's experience, as is care for both adult and pediatric patients. The fellow will also have the opportunity to work within well-established multidisciplinary teams for the treatment of head and neck cancer, intracranial tumors, vestibular disorders and adult and pediatric cochlear implantation

Research: Required – Depending on the specific interests of the fellow, weekly dedicated time is allotted to pursue clinical and/or basic science/translational research across the vast Mount Sinai Health system.
